JANUARY 4, 2016

The City Council of the City of Gulf Shores, Alabama met in a Council Work Session Meeting on Monday, January 4, 2016 at 4:00 p.m. with Mayor Craft presiding. The meeting was held at City Hall.

Upon roll call, the following members answered present: Councilman Garris, Doughty, Harris, Dyken, Jones and Mayor Craft. The meeting was called to order. The Council discussed general business to include:

1. Councilmember Discussion Period – Councilman Doughty  
Councilman Doughty inquired regarding prohibition of unsolicited weekly advertising packets being left on driveways causing litter and nuisance to private property owners. Director of Planning and Zoning, Andy Bauer stated he would research and follow up. Councilman Doughty then asked Director of Public Works, Mark Acreman, to evaluate the feasibility of constructing a parking lot at the trailhead in the area of The Peninsula subdivision off Fort Morgan Road. Mr. Acreman will research and report.

Councilman Jones then announced the E-Cycle and Shred Event, sponsored by the Coastal Alabama Business Chamber, has been scheduled for Saturday, January 16, 2016. This annual, free event will be held at Gulf State Park Pavilion parking lot from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 Noon. In order to continue providing this annual service free of charge to citizens, the consensus of the Council was to appropriate up to \$4,000.00 towards the cost of the event which will be divided equally between the cities of Gulf Shores and Orange Beach and the Chamber.


