The City Council of the City of Gulf Shores, Alabama met in a Council Work Session Meeting on Monday, February 1, 2016 at 4:00 p.m. with Mayor Pro Tempore Doughty presiding. The meeting was held at City Hall.


1. Councilman Discussion Period – Councilman Dyken
