**MINUTES OF
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
CITY OF GULF SHORES, ALABAMA
OCTOBER 10, 2016**

Mayor Craft called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. at City Hall. The invocation was delivered by Deputy Fire Chief Keith Martin.

Upon roll call, the following officials answered "present": Councilmen Garris, Doughty, Harris, Jones and Mayor Craft. Councilman Dyken was absent.

Councilman Garris then moved to approve the minutes of the Special Council Meeting of September 26, 2016 as presented; seconded by Councilman Doughty; was regularly put; was discussed and considered in full by the Council; and upon the question, the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Garris, "aye", Councilman Doughty, "aye", Councilman Harris, "aye", Councilman Jones, "aye", and Mayor Craft, "aye". Councilman Dyken was absent. Whereupon, Mayor Craft declared the motion carried.

At this time, Councilman Harris moved to approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting of September 26, 2016, as presented; seconded by Councilman Jones; was regularly put; was discussed and considered in full by the Council; and upon the question, the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Garris, "aye", Doughty, "aye", Councilman Harris, "aye", Councilman Jones, "aye", and Mayor Craft, "aye". Councilman Dyken was absent. Whereupon, Mayor Craft declared the motion carried.

Furthermore, Councilman Garris moved to approve the minutes of the Council Work Session Meeting of October 3, 2016, as presented; seconded by Councilman Doughty; was regularly put; was discussed and considered in full by the Council; and upon the question, the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Garris, "aye", Councilman Doughty "aye", Councilman Harris, "aye", Councilman Jones, "abstain", and Mayor Craft, "aye". Councilman Dyken was absent. Whereupon, Mayor Craft declared the motion carried.

Councilman Jones moved to approve the expense vouchers in the amount of \$431,047.33; seconded by Councilman Harris; and the vote of those officials present was unanimously in favor of the motion.

The City Clerk noted that the complete list of vouchers to be paid, as reflected on a computer printout, had been made a permanent record in the Clerk's office.

At this time, Director of Recreation and Cultural Affairs, Grant Brown introduced a Public Assembly Permit Application from the City of Gulf Shores and Gulf Shores & Orange Beach Tourism to host the NCAA National Beach Volleyball Championship on May 4 – 7, 2017.

Councilman Doughty moved to approve the Assembly Permit Application from City of Gulf Shores, Gulf Shores & Orange Tourism to host the NCAA National Beach Volleyball Championship as presented; seconded by Councilman Harris; and the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Garris, "aye", Councilman Doughty, "aye", Councilman Harris, "aye", Councilman Jones, "aye" and Mayor Craft, "aye". Councilman Dyken was absent. Whereupon, Mayor Craft declared the motion carried.

Again, Director of Recreation and Cultural Affairs, Grant Brown introduced a Public Assembly Permit Application from Gulf Shores & Orange Beach Tourism to host the NJCAA Half Marathon to be held on November 19, 2016.

Councilman Harris moved to approve the Assembly Permit Application from Gulf Shores & Orange Tourism to host the NJCAA Half Marathon as presented, seconded by Councilman Garris; and the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Jones, "aye", Councilman Doughty, "aye", Councilman

Harris, “aye”, Councilman Jones, “aye” and Mayor Craft, “aye”. Councilman Dyken was absent. Whereupon, Mayor Craft declared the motion carried.

Director of Recreation and Cultural Affairs, Grant Brown introduced a Public Assembly Permit Application from the HO-MF, LLC to host the Hangout Oyster Cook-Off and Craft Beer Weekend on November 4 – 5, 2016, with an additional request from the applicant to have one extra day added to the permit for setup.

Councilman Jones moved to approve the Assembly Permit Application as amended, from HO-MF, LLC to host the Hangout Oyster Cook-Off and Craft Beer Weekend , seconded by Councilman Harris; and the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Garris, “aye”, Councilman Doughty, “aye”, Councilman Harris, “aye”, Councilman Jones, “aye” and Mayor Craft, “aye”. Councilman Dyken was absent. Whereupon, Mayor Craft declared the motion carried.

Furthermore, Director of Recreation and Cultural Affairs, Grant Brown introduced a Public Assembly Permit Application from Team Magic, Inc. to host the Kaiser Coastal Half Marathon, 5K and 1 Mile Run on November 26, 2016.

Councilman Doughty moved to approve the Assembly Permit Application from Team Magic, Inc. to host the Kaiser Coastal Half Marathon, 5K and 1 Mile Run as presented, seconded by Councilman Harris; and the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Garris, “aye”, Councilman Doughty, “aye”, Councilman Harris, “aye”, Councilman Jones, “aye” and Mayor Craft, “aye”. Councilman Dyken was absent. Whereupon, Mayor Craft declared the motion carried.

Mayor Craft stated that this was the time and place for the public hearing, as advertised, on three (3) applications for transfer of a Lounge Retail Liquor Class II Package and Tobacco Only Licenses from Pinkis Fine Wine and Spirits, Inc.

The City Clerk stated that Pink Pony Pub Restaurant business owners Bob Patel and his son, Vijay Patel, have purchased the three Gulf Shores locations of Montelaro Tobacco Road. Their business Pinkis Beverages, Inc. d/b/a ALS Liquor Tobacco Beer and ALS Liquor Tobacco and Wine desires to transfer the existing Lounge Retail Liquor Class II Package Licenses and Tobacco Licenses from the three existing Tobacco Road locations. Location #1 is 1620 Gulf Shores Parkway. Location #2 is 817 Gulf Shores Parkway and location #3 is 1545 Gulf Shores Parkway. The City Clerk reported the dates on which the required advertising was done. There were no written objections received and no citizens appeared at the hearing to object. The Clerk stated the license would need to be approved contingent upon the applicant’s successful completion of all City departmental final inspections.

Whereupon, Councilman Jones moved to approve the three applications from Pinkis Beverages, Inc. d/b/a ALS Liquor Tobacco Beer and Pinkis Fine Wine and Spirits, Inc. d/b/a ALS Liquor Tobacco Wine as presented and to so notify the ABC Board; seconded by Councilman Doughty; and the vote of those officials present was unanimously in favor of the motion.

Section 3. The construction of the Little Lagoon Pass Park Pier will be partially funded through a \$50,000 ACAMP grant obtained earlier this year. The \$17,730 design fee represents approximately 14% of the estimated \$120,000 project cost.

Jason Stephenson with Dolphin Dads gave an update on the projects the group was working on at Gulf Shores Elementary School.



