January – March

Jan 9 & Jan 13: One Woman, One Vote, American Experience DVD documenting the struggle and opposition early crusaders faced from men and women who feared the women's vote would ignite a social revolution.

Jan 16 & Jan 20: The Wizard of Photography, American Experience DVD chronicles George Eastman's photographic industry.

Jan 23 & Jan 27: Radio: Out of Thin Air, History Channel's Modern Marvel series documents how radio changed life in America.

Jan 30: Woodrow Wilson, This two-part DVD recalls the transformation of a history professor into one of America's greatest presidents who led us into World War I. This first-part will be repeated Wed Feb 3; visit Feb 6 or Feb 10 for part two.

Feb 3: Woodrow Wilson. *Repeat* of part-one DVD; see Jan 30 for detail listing.

Feb 6 & Feb 10: Woodrow Wilson, *Part Two* of the American Experience DVD which concludes the story of the gifted orator, who while extremely confident before crowds was ultimately brought down by his stubborn search for peace and an incapacitating stroke.

Feb 13 & Feb 17: Aces High-Air Warfare 1914 – 1918, chosen from the *Century of Warfare Collection*, this program looks at the types of aircraft which brought about a revolution in warfare, the men who flew them, and the tactics they used.

Feb 20 & Feb 24: Blood & Mud–Trench Warfare in the West 1914 – 1918, this program, also chosen from the *Century of Warfare Collection*, depicts the story of bloody campaigns in northern France, the nature of trench warfare, and the weapons with which the stalemate was finally broken.

Feb 27: William March/Company K, this independent film is an adaptation of the Mobile author's novel chronicling his life experiences during "The Great War". A repeat showing of this video will be on March 3.

March 3: William March/Company K, a repeat of last month's presentation of local author's life experiences during "The Great War".

Mar 6 & Mar 10: Influenza 1918, American Experience DVD chronicles the epidemic that killed 675,000 Americans before disappearing as mysteriously as it began.

Mar 13 & Mar 17: Landslide: Herbert Hoover, Documentary examines Hoover's early life, the international experiences that led to his decision to run for office, and its lasting impact on government.

Mar 20 & Mar 24: The Crash of 1929, American Experience DVD explores the attitudes and arrogance of economists and investors preceding the stock market crash of 1929.

Mar 27 & Mar 31: Civilian Conservation Corps, American Experience DVD tells the story of one of the boldest and most popular New Deal experiments positioning it as a pivotal moment in the emergence of modern environmentalism and federal unemployment relief.
