8. Mayor Updates

Chief Building Official Brandan Franklin gave a brief update on the beach erosion stating we know a lot more now than we did a couple of weeks ago when I was up here. As many of you know, we were scheduled to start our re-nourishment this past fall. Due to some unexpected guidelines FEMA put in place, our project was placed on hold. Our approvals have been held up by EHP, Environmental and Historical Preservation. The city was told last Wednesday their review is now complete and will hopefully get the paperwork processed to the next step, which is PA, Public Assistance. PA has stated they are sitting on go and once everything is received from EHP, they will send it on to Washington for final signatures. Further stating, he wanted to remind everyone this process would still have to occur whether the City paid for it out of pocket or using Federal Funds. Once we receive all Federal approvals, there are still some State laws and regulations that take some time and we have to follow those to award this project to a contractor. So he just asked everyone to remain patient.


