**MINUTES OF  
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING  
CITY OF GULF SHORES, ALABAMA  
AUGUST 9, 2021**

Mayor Robert Craft called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. at the Gulf Shores City Hall Council Chambers.

The invocation was delivered by Councilman Stephen E. Jones.

Upon roll call, the following officials answered "present": Councilman Joe Garris, Jr., Councilman Philip Harris, Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D., Councilman Stephen E. Jones and Mayor Robert Craft. Councilman Gary M. Sinak was absent.

Councilman Joe Garris, Jr. moved to approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting of July 26, 2021, as presented; seconded by Councilman Stephen E. Jones; was discussed and considered in full by the Council; and upon the question, the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Joe Garris, Jr., "aye", Councilman Philip Harris, "aye", Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D., "aye", Councilman Stephen E. Jones, "aye" and Mayor Robert Craft, "aye". Whereupon, Mayor Robert Craft declared the motion carried. Councilman Gary M. Sinak was absent.

At this time, Councilman Stephen E. Jones moved to approve the minutes of the Council Work Session Meeting of August 2, 2021, as presented; seconded by Councilman Philip Harris; was discussed and considered in full by the Council; and upon the question, the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Joe Garris, Jr., "abstain", Councilman Philip Harris, "aye", Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D., "aye", Councilman Stephen E. Jones, "abstain" and Mayor Robert Craft, "abstain". Whereupon, Mayor Robert Craft declared the motion carried. Councilman Gary M. Sinak was absent.

Councilman Philip Harris moved to approve the expense vouchers in the amount of \$1,074,179.17; seconded by Councilman Stephen E. Jones; and the vote of those officials present was unanimously in favor of the motion.

The City Clerk noted that the complete list of vouchers to be paid, as reflected on a computer printout, had been made a permanent record in the Clerk's office.

At this time, Assistant Director of Recreation and Cultural Affairs Matt Young presented a Proclamation recognizing September as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. Further recognizing Melissa and Lynn Byrd of Jensen's Heart of Gold and Jennifer Berry representing the Berry Strong Foundation. Both thanked the Mayor and Council for the Proclamation and gave a brief summary of their organizations and how they help families with loved ones dealing with cancer.

Chief Mark Sealy introduced 3 new hires, Jean Tinoco, Cole Fincher and Ashlee Barnard, gave a brief summary of each of their work histories before he swore them all in as new firefighters.

Steiner and Earl Richardson representing the Baldwin County National Sojourners, a group composed of Veterans and Masons, gave a brief summary of the patriotic work of this group and invited all to attend the First Responders Day Event in Baldwin County to honor first responders. 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WHEREAS, Rock and Roll Offs and ABM Waste Management have requested a franchise to empower the Corporations to collect and dispose of construction and demolition debris only; and

WHEREAS, the City is desirous of granting a nonexclusive franchise to Rock and Roll Offs and ABM Waste Management to accomplish such; and

WHEREAS, the residents of the City will be benefited by the granting of such a franchise;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GULF SHORES, ALABAMA, WHILE IN REGULAR SESSION ON AUGUST 9, 2021, as follows:

**Section 1.** That a nonexclusive franchise be and it is hereby granted to Rock and Roll Offs and ABM Waste Management for the collection and disposal of construction and demolition debris only within the corporate limits of the City.

**Section 3.** That the subject Franchise Agreement, the full text of which is available for examination in the office of the City Clerk, is dated August 9, 2021.

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WHEREAS, on the 19<sup>th</sup> of July, 2021 Mr. & Mrs. Robert Sheehan, owner of all the real property hereinafter described, did file with the City Clerk a petition asking that the said tracts or parcels of land be annexed to and become a part of the City of Gulf Shores; and

WHEREAS, said petition did contain the signatures of all of the owners of the described territory and a map of said property showing its relationship to the corporate limits of the City of Gulf Shores; and

WHEREAS, the governing body did determine that it is in the public interest that said property be annexed to the City of Gulf Shores and it did further determine that all legal requirements for annexing said real property have been met pursuant to Sections 11-42-20 through 11-42-24, Code of Alabama, 1975;

**Section 3.** That this ordinance shall be published as provided by law, and a certified copy of same, together with a certified copy of the petition of the property owners, shall be filed with the Probate Judge of Baldwin County, Alabama.

**Section 4.** That the territory described in this ordinance shall become a part of the corporate limits of the City of Gulf Shores, Alabama, upon publication of this ordinance as set forth in Section 3 above.

**Section 5.** That this Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption and publication as required by law.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS:

#### STAFF REPORT:

Chief Building Official/Emergency Management Director, Brandan Franklin, gave an update on the status of active COVID cases in Baldwin County. Hospitals are at capacity, 90% - 95% of patients with COVID are not vaccinated, testing and vaccine clinics are available through the Health Department and additional information can be found on the Alabama Department of Public Health website ([www.adph.org](http://www.adph.org)).

Director of Public Works, Noel Hand, presented an update on the status of the ditch and culvert cleaning project around the city. Bids will be open on September 1, 2021 to award a contract for additional ditch cleaning work to be performed by an outside company.

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Dr. Matt Akin, Superintendent of Gulf Shores City Schools, announced that the Teacher Institute for Gulf Shores City Schools held this morning (Monday, August 9 from 7:45 – 10:30 a.m.) at the Cultural Center was a great success. It was the perfect kick-off to the 2021-2022 school year. Dr. Akin also stated that the decision had been made to mandate students in Grades 2 – 12 wear masks. Hopefully, this mandate will not last too long, but in an abundance of caution, school will start with the mandate in place.

Former State Representative Randy Davis announced that he had retired after sixteen years of political service and was now working for Columbia Southern University in the Governmental Affairs Department.

Two citizens addressed the Council regarding property damage caused by short term renters. They read a list of violations they had witnessed. Mayor Craft asked them to email their written information and recommendations to him for review and response.

Mr. Eddie McDonald, President of the local Bama Beach Pickleball Club thanked the Mayor and Council for authorizing the design and construction of the new pickleball courts at the Sportsplex. Mr. and Mrs. Bill Reed distributed Pickleball magazines to the Mayor and Council.

Mr. Tony DiLiberto stated that he was in full support of the Mayor's statement concerning negotiations between ALDOT and the Beach Express Toll Bridge owners. It is time for ALDOT to build the new bridge.

Mr. Kevin Corcoran, Chairman of the Gulf Shores Board of Education, announced the Board's next meeting is Thursday, August 12, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

There being no further business to come before the Council, Councilman Joe Garris, Jr. moved to adjourn; seconded by Councilman Stephen E. Jones; and the vote of those officials present was unanimously in favor of the motion.
