RESCUED COUNCIL WORK SESSION &
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
CITY OF GULF SHORES, ALABAMA
SEPTEMBER 28, 2020**

Mayor Robert Craft called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. at the Erie Hall Meyer Civic Center. Mayor Craft noted that the location of the meeting had been moved to the Erie Hall Meyer Civic Center in order to provide enough space to maintain social distancing for everyone in attendance. The meeting was streamed via Facebook Live at <https://www.facebook.com/cityofgulfshoresal>.

The invocation was delivered by Youth Pastor Josh Williams, Gulf Shores United Methodist Church. Mayor Robert Craft thanked Mr. Williams for all his hard work at the church assisting with the coordinating of volunteers, donations and distributions there.

Upon roll call, the following officials answered "present": Councilman Joe Garris, Jr., Councilman Gary M. Sinak, Councilman Philip Harris, Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D., Councilman Stephen E. Jones and Mayor Robert Craft.

Councilman Joe Garris, Jr. moved to approve the minutes of the Special Meeting of September 14, 2020, as presented; seconded by Councilman Gary Sinak; was discussed and considered in full by the Council; and upon the question, the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Joe Garris, Jr., "aye"; Councilman Gary M. Sinak, "aye"; Councilman Philip Harris, "aye"; Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D., "aye"; Councilman Stephen E. Jones, "aye" and Mayor Robert Craft, "aye". Whereupon, Mayor Robert Craft declared the motion carried.

At this time, Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D. moved to approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting of September 14, 2020, as presented; seconded by Councilman Philip Harris; was discussed and considered in full by the Council; and upon the question, the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Joe Garris, Jr., "aye"; Councilman Gary Sinak, "aye"; Councilman Philip Harris, "aye"; Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D., "aye"; Councilman Stephen E. Jones, "aye" and Mayor Robert Craft, "aye". Whereupon, Mayor Robert Craft declared the motion carried.

Councilman Philip Harris moved to approve the expense vouchers in the amount of \$190,240.00 seconded by Councilman Joe Garris, Jr.; and the vote of those officials present was unanimously in favor of the motion.

The City Clerk noted that the complete list of vouchers to be paid, as reflected on a computer printout, had been made a permanent record in the Clerk's office.

At this time, Chief Building Inspector / Emergency Manager Brandan Franklin gave an update on damage assessment of property and beaches, also how the debris collection and relief effort was going from Hurricane Sally.

At this time, Mayor Robert Craft administered the Oath of Office to Daniel A. Netemeyer confirming him as the new Gulf Shores Police Department Deputy Chief. Deputy Chief Dan Netemeyer will be replacing Deputy Chief Fred Beaman who after a total of 48 years in law enforcement and 40 years of service with the Gulf Shores Police Department will be retiring.

Furthermore, Chief of Police Ed Delmore recognize the officers as recipients to the following awards; ACE Awards: Seth Headley, Shane Calvert, Chris Childress and Josh Hoguet. Life Saving Award: Justin Schulz and Ben Hancock. Medal of Valor: James Johnston, Shawn Andrews, James Lord and Darrell Franklin. Combat Cross: James Lord and Darrell Franklin. Darrell Franklin will be retiring after 25 years of service with the Gulf Shores Police Department.

**A RESOLUTION
ADOPTING A CITY OF GULF SHORES
FY2021 TRANSPORTATION PLAN**

WHEREAS, in March, 2019, the Alabama Legislature passed the Rebuild Alabama Act (HB2) implementing a statewide gas tax increase to help with transportation infrastructure funding; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gulf Shores received \$48,000 in 2020 and is slated to receive an estimated \$64,000 in FY2021, and \$80,000 annually thereafter; and

WHEREAS, in order to be eligible to receive funds and continue to participate in the program, each municipality must first adopt an annual transportation plan and continue to follow the stated guidelines of the initial program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GULF SHORES, ALABAMA, WHILE IN REGULAR SESSION ON SEPTEMBER 28, 2020, as follows:

Section 1. That in accordance with the Rebuild Alabama Act signed into law on March 12, 2019, the City of Gulf Shores hereby adopts an annual Transportation Plan and will use the Rebuild Alabama revenue allocation, of an estimated \$64,000.00 during the FY 2021, to assist in the funding of roadway improvements, repairs, resurfacing, reconstruction or maintenance of the following roads and bridges within the City of Gulf Shores existing street/road network during said fiscal year; and

Gulf Beach Walking District Improvements

Annual City Streets Resurfacing and Pedestrian Improvement Projects

Section 2. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

WHEREAS, the City of Gulf Shores recognized the need to provide leading edge healthcare for its citizens without the exorbitant out of pocket expenses for air and ground ambulance service even after co-pays.

WHEREAS, Medstar Emergency Medical Service is the exclusive ground ambulance provider in Baldwin County, who also operates two medical helicopters. Together, we found a solution that we felt greatly benefited the citizens of Gulf Shores who live within the corporate limits and on September 23, 2019, Council adopted Resolution 6189-19 authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute an agreement with AirMedCare Network to provide Ground Ambulance and Air Emergency Transport Service at a substantially reduced rate to the residents of Gulf Shores.

WHEREAS, the term of this initial municipal site membership agreement will expire September 30, 2020 and therefore it is necessary for the Council to authorize renewal of the agreement for an additional year and also provide an additional payment for the remaining portion of the municipal site membership service for the 2020 term beginning October 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2020 in an amount not to exceed \$205,085.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GULF SHORES, ALABAMA, WHILE IN REGULAR SESSION ON SEPTEMBER 28, 2020, as follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor and City Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute and attest, respectively, a municipal site membership agreement between the City of Gulf Shores and AirMedCare Network to provide Ground Ambulance and Air Emergency Transport Service to the residents of Gulf Shores from October 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021 in an amount not to exceed \$205,085.00; and in substantially the form presented to Council this date.

Section 2. The annual agreement will now be changed to a calendar year term of one (1) year, commencing on January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2021.

Section 3. That the AirMedCare Network shall provide Ground Ambulance and Air Emergency Transport Service to the residents of Gulf Shores from October 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021 in an amount not to exceed \$205,085.00 and shall be paid from the FY2020 in an amount not to exceed \$42,000.00 and FY2021 General Fund - Fire Department Budget in an amount not to exceed \$164,000.00 from Account No. 01-535-65250; and

Section 4. That this Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.

A RESOLUTION
IN SUPPORT OF AMENDMENT 2
BALDWIN BEACH EXPRESS II EXPANSION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the City of Gulf Shores in the State of Alabama does hereby find as follows:

WHEREAS, a local, constitutional amendment proposing the expansion of the Baldwin Beach Express with a new roadway, the Baldwin Beach Express II, connecting Interstate 10 to Interstate 65 is on the Baldwin County General Election ballot on November 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Amendment 2 on the General Election ballot proposes the establishment of a toll authority to oversee this roadway extension, projected to cost \$200 million, to be fully paid for by users of the new roadway; and

WHEREAS, development of the proposed new roadway will NOT require the closure of or limited access to any current transportation routes or roadways, ensuring that only those visitors and citizens who wish to use the new road will pay for it; and

WHEREAS, Baldwin County has experienced rapid growth and development in five years' time, making the Baldwin Beach Express II critical infrastructure in order to establish a strong and ready foundation for the future economic security and prosperity of our citizens; and

WHEREAS, an additional roadway will secure a safe and efficient alternative evacuation route for Baldwin County residents and visitors during hurricane season and provide an additional route for public safety and health officers to assist the community in the event of a natural disaster; and

WHEREAS, Baldwin County has long been a world class destination for visitors and beachgoers from throughout the country and promoting enhanced accessibility for visitors is vital for Baldwin County residents whose businesses thrive off tourist and visitor traffic; and

WHEREAS, the proposed additional roadway will provide additional economic opportunity for the citizens of Baldwin County by providing a new transportation artery adjacent to the Baldwin County Economic Development Megasite; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Baldwin Beach Express II will enhance the overall quality of life for the citizens of Gulf Shores and Baldwin County alike for generations to come.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GULF SHORES, ALABAMA, WHILE IN REGULAR SESSION ON SEPTEMBER 28, 2020, as follows:

Section 1. That the City of Gulf Shores does hereby endorse and strongly supports Amendment 2 and the proposed establishment of a toll authority to financially support and expeditiously construct the expansion of the Baldwin Beach Express II.

Section 2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to take such action as he deems necessary to communicate and implement the City's support of this development; and

Section 3. That this Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 1990

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE PROJECT DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT DATED JULY 23, 2018 BETWEEN THE CITY AND DD PARTNERS, LLC

WHEREAS, on July 23, 2018 the City Council (the “Council”) adopted (i) Resolution No. 6017-18 (the “Resolution”), making certain findings with respect to Amendment No. 750 of the Alabama Constitution of 1901, as amended, and, following the adoption of such Resolution, adopted (ii) Ordinance No. 1902 (the “Ordinance”) thereunder, approving, among other things, a Project Development Agreement dated July 23, 2018 (the “Agreement”) with DD Partners, LLC (the “Company”), and the issuance by the City of a Limited Obligation Project Revenue Warrant, Series 2019-A, to be dated the date of delivery (the “Warrant”), payable to the Company (or registered assigns), pursuant to said Amendment No. 750.

WHEREAS, the Company has requested and the City has agreed to consider further extending the Project Commencement Date.

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to agree to such extension.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GULF SHORES, ALABAMA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Findings and Representations.

The City of Gulf Shores (the “City”), by and through the City Council, its governing body, does hereby find and determine that the foregoing WHEREAS clauses are accurate and correct in all general respects and are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Authorization of Third Amendment to Project Development Agreement.

(a) The Third Amendment to Project Development Agreement, in substantially the form presented to this meeting, is hereby approved and authorized and the Mayor and City Clerk/Treasurer are further authorized and directed to execute, attest, seal, and deliver the same.

(b) A copy of the substantial form of such Third Amendment to Project Development is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 3. Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable. In the event that any one or more of such provisions or the provisions of the Warrant shall, for any reason, be held illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this Ordinance or of the Warrant, and this Ordinance and the Warrant shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provision had not been contained herein or therein.

Section 4. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions.

All ordinances, proceedings and orders or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 5. Effective Date.

That this Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption and publication as required by law.

The motion for unanimous consent was seconded by Councilman Joe Garris, Jr.; and upon the question, the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Joe Garris, Jr., “aye”; Councilman Gary M. Sinak, “aye”; Councilman Philip Harris, “aye”; Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D., “aye”; Councilman Stephen E. Jones, “aye”; Mayor Robert Craft, “aye”. Mayor Robert Craft then declared the rules suspended.

Councilman Philip Harris then moved for the adoption of Ordinance No. 1990 and to waive the reading of said Ordinance at length. The motion for the adoption of Ordinance No. 1990 was seconded by Councilman Gary M. Sinak; was discussed and considered in full by the Council; and upon the question, the vote thereon was as follows: Councilman Joe Garris, Jr., “aye”; Councilman Gary M. Sinak, “aye”; Councilman Philip Harris, “aye”; Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D., “aye”; Councilman Stephen E. Jones, “aye”; and Mayor Robert Crafts, “aye”. Mayor Robert Craft declared Ordinance No. 1990 duly and legally adopted.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Joe Garris, Jr. commended Chief Building Official / Emergency Manager Brandon Franklin on an outstanding job during the pre-storm and post-storm dealings of Hurricane Sally.

STAFF REPORT:

Department Heads presented City project updates.

Gulf Shores City School Board President Kevin Corcoran announced the schools reopened this morning and thanked the Public Works Department for all their hard work making that happen.

Local rental management owner Bill Bender expressed concerns with opening the beaches slated for October 2nd. He didn't feel the area was ready for the onslaught of visitors. Mayor Craft addressed his concerns and would reach out to Herb Malone of the CVB for his thoughts.

There being no further business to come before the Council, Councilman Joe Garris, Jr. moved to adjourn; seconded by Councilman Philip Harris; and the vote of those officials present was unanimously in favor of the motion.

Mayor Robert Craft declared the meeting adjourned at 5:17 p.m.
