The City Council of the City of Gulf Shores, Alabama met in a Council Work Session Meeting on Monday, October 5, 2020 at 4:08 p.m. with Mayor Robert Craft presiding. Mayor Craft noted that the location of the meeting had been moved to the Erie Hall Meyer Civic Center in order to provide enough space to maintain social distancing for everyone in attendance. Mayor Robert Craft gave an update of the Hurricane Sally recovery effort, further stating it was time to prep for Tropical Storm Delta which could possibly impact the Gulf Coast.

At this time, Angie Swiger raised concerns regarding the ditches and culverts on Wedgewood Drive being overgrown and the flooding she experienced during Hurricane Sally. Another local resident in that area voiced concerns regarding flooding, stating the water collected in ditches at West 23rd Avenue and 2nd Street has nowhere to drain and would like someone to look at the situation. Further concerns included overhead power poles and the price of obtaining a business license to work in the city after a storm. These concerns were addressed by appropriate staff.

Bill Coyne also addressed the Mayor and Council regarding the cost of a business license after a disaster. These concerns were addressed as well.
