The City of Gulf Shores Announces Christmas and New Year’s Holiday Closure Schedule

Gulf Shores, Ala. – As you begin to make plans for the holidays, please take note of the following City of Gulf Shores closures:

Christmas Holiday Closures:

- Police, Fire, and other emergency services will remain open to ensure public safety and health.
- Administrative offices for the City of Gulf Shores will be closed on Thursday, December 23, and Friday, December 24. Regular operations will resume on Monday, December 27.
- The Gulf Shores City Store will be closed on Friday, December 24, and Saturday, December 25. Regular operations will resume on Monday, December 27.
- The Thomas B. Norton Library will be closed Friday, December 24, through Sunday, December 26. Regular operations will resume on Monday, December 27.
- The Gulf Shores Museum will be closed Friday, December 24 through Monday, December 27. Regular operations will resume on Tuesday, December 28.
- The Bodenhamer Recreation Center and George C. Meyer Tennis Center will be closed on Friday, December 24, and Saturday, December 25. Regular operations will resume on Sunday, December 26. Tennis courts will remain open and available for play throughout the holidays.
- Republic Services Garbage and Recycling Services will run as scheduled.
- Yard Debris/Bulky Pick-Up routes scheduled for service on Thursday, December 23, and Friday, December 24, will be picked up earlier in the week, between Monday, December 20, and Wednesday, December 22. Residents should place all debris at the roadside by Sunday evening, December 19, to ensure pickup. The self-service City of Gulf Shores Recycling Center, located at 160 W 36th Ave., will remain open for drop-offs regardless of the holiday schedule.

New Year's Eve and New Year's Day

- Police, Fire, and other emergency services will remain open to ensure public safety and health.
- Administrative offices for the City of Gulf Shores will be closed on Friday, December 31, and Monday, January 3. Regular operations will resume on Tuesday, January 4.
- The City Council Committee of the Whole meeting will be held Tuesday, January 4, at 4 p.m.
- The Gulf Shores City Store will be closed on Friday, December 31, and Saturday, January 1. Regular operations will resume on Monday, January 3.
- The Thomas B. Norton Library will be closed Friday, December 31, through Sunday, January 2. Regular operations will resume on Monday, January 3.
- The Gulf Shores Museum will be closed Friday, December 31 through Monday, January 3. Regular operations will resume on Tuesday, January 4.
- The Bodenhamer Recreation Center will close at 1 p.m. on Friday, December 31 and remain closed on Saturday, January 1. Normal operations will resume on Sunday, January 2. The George C. Meyer Tennis Center will be closed on Friday, December 31, and Saturday, January 1. Regular operations will resume on Monday, January 3. Tennis courts will remain open and available for play throughout the holidays.
- Republic Services Garbage and Recycling Services will run as scheduled.
- Yard Debris/Bulky Pick-Up routes scheduled for service on Thursday, December 30, and Friday, December 31, will be picked up earlier in the week between Monday, December 27, and Wednesday, December 29. Residents should place all debris at the roadside by Sunday evening, December 26, to ensure pickup. The self-service City of Gulf Shores Recycling Center, located at 160 W 36th Ave., will remain open for drop-offs regardless of the holiday schedule.
