ALARM PERMIT
AUTOMATIC AND MANUAL ALARM SYSTEMS

Dear Licensee:

If you wish the Gulf Shores Police Department to respond to your alarm when called in by your alarm monitoring company, please complete the enclosed application form in its entirety and send it, along with the annual fee of \$20.00, within (10) days after receipt of this letter to City of Gulf Shores, P.O. Box 896, Gulf Shores, AL 36547. Checks should be made payable to the City of Gulf Shores.

Ordinance No. 356, which was adopted by the city on March 24, 1986, regulates the installation, maintenance, and operation of all alarms. It established penalties for failure to obtain a permit from the operation of an alarm device. A copy of Ordinance No. 356 will be mailed to you upon request.

Also, it outlines service fees applicable for false alarms. After the third false alarm within a permit year, a warning notice will be issued. Upon receipt of the fourth false alarm, the alarm user will be subject to a service fee. The service fee increases as additional false alarms are received in the permit year. Upon receipt of the tenth false alarm, a Notice of Revocation of the permit will be issued by the Chief of Police.
